7 Footpaths, Speeding and Road Signage Damage Update:
Footpath from Blyford Village to the River Blyth: Ongoing. Action: Cllr Goldbart

**Speeding:** Cllr Goldbart liaising with Suffolk County Councillor, Annette Dunning, to arrange a site meeting with an area highways engineer concerning extending the 30-mph speed restriction eastwards beyond the Queens Head Public House has been delayed due to Covid.

A resident reported speeding lorries and cars, especially in the early hours of the morning. Cllr Goldbart proposed that we apply to join the Police CSW scheme where members of the Community are trained in the use of hand-held speed guns and conduct roadside monitoring. Details of any speeding vehicles are passed to the Police who issue warning letters to the drivers involved. A Community will need a minimum of 6 volunteers to apply to join the scheme. We presently have 3. Action: Cllr Goldbart to continue to liaise with Cllr Dunning and to seek more volunteers for CSW scheme. Clerk to find out who has data stored on our shared VAS equipment.

**Signage damage:** Report of missing road sign at junction of Kings Road and the B1124 Beccles Road was uploaded to Suffolk Highways reporting tool. Response received was that it does not warrant remedial action but they will monitor the situation and if the matter worsens significantly they will take action.

- 8 Community Orchard at Queens Head Public House, Blyford: Trees have been purchased and planting will take place later in the year. Adnams as owners of the land have given the Landlord of the Queens Head Pub their written agreement for this project to proceed. Action: Clerk to obtain a copy of agreement for our records.
- **Defibrillator:** Cllr Goldbart proposed purchasing a defibrillator for Blyford Village and looking into grant funding for this. Unanimously agreed by Council. *Action: Cllr Goldbart*.
- 10 SALC Local Council Conference November 2023: Cllr Goldbart attended this conference which included Meet Suffolk's new highways partners Milestone Infrastructure in a Question-and-Answer session, planning etc.
- 11 Suffolk in Bloom: All bulbs have been planted around the public areas of Blyford and Sotherton.
- Planning for 2024 Events: Agreed by Council to look into arranging a D-Day 80 Event for all residents of Blyford and Sotherton at the Racehorse Community Pub in Westhall on 6<sup>th</sup> June 2024. Action: Clerk to check availability in the first instance.
